## Steven Conner 4:25

Good afternoon, everyone. We'll give about a minute for some people showing up late to get in, and we'll get the meeting started. All right, good afternoon, everyone. We'll get started here. I'm Steven Conner, the city engineer with the City of Henderson.

Jeff Radke, who's the project manager for the 215 project, and Kevie Remynse, who is our project oversight who works for the city of Henderson. So we're here on stakeholder meeting number six. We're all here, obviously, for the 215 widening project. We have some pretty good updates that Kevie will bring up to the group.

One, we have a pretty permanent/temporary traffic control configuration on the 215, little tongue twister. That's going to stay like that for a while. We made some progress with all the grinding that you guys seen over the last few months on the surface of the 215. And there's a lot of drainage improvements and other improvements going along the corridor that Kevie will update you with.

But I'm going to turn it over to Kevie. And Kevie, if you don't mind giving the group an update.

Good afternoon, everyone. Cassie, can you go ahead and go to the next slide? All right. So yeah, if you can take that off screen. I don't know. It's her screen. Cassie, can you get your microphone thing off possibly?

It's covering our screen a little bit.

It's okay. It must just be froze on mine. Okay, we'll get going.

# **Kevie Remynse** 7:59

Okay, so 215 Pecos to Stephanie. We continue to work on the storm drain installation removals. As you can see in the photo, the retaining walls have started. They have the footing in. They're starting to build the wall reinforcement, and then you have the forms on the one side.

Currently, we do have a little bit of nighttime work, 9pm to 6am, Sunday night through Friday morning. Three lanes are maintained in each direction during the day. And we will have some lane reductions as needed in the overnight hours. Currently, there's not any planned unless something pops up where it needs to happen last minute. So please expect the three lanes in each direction during the day and nighttime hours. And as Steve mentioned, we are in the new lane configuration for the duration of construction. We will have some potential shifts towards the end of the project, but for a long period of time, this is how the traveling public will be.

I just want to know one thing. And Kevie, correct me if I'm wrong, but we have the same amount of lanes and auxiliary lanes as we did from before the job until now, correct?

Correct.

All right, next slide. Okay, so the ramp work. So eastbound off ramp to Pecos, we do have some storm drain work that will continue in the area that's slated to start in the next week or two. That will be nighttime work. Again, 9pm to 6am, Sunday night through Friday morning. There will be lane restrictions on the off-ramp for that work.

Additionally, for the westbound off-ramp to Pecos, we will have lane restrictions there. And again, that will start in the next week or two in the overnight hours. And you can see in the picture, they're working on placing a manhole. That's the barrel. And that's the junction point of two of the pipes for the storm drain system, of the pipes.

Next slide.

All right, surface streets. So Paseo Verde at St. Rose Parkway, we continue the installation of conduit, traffic signal relocations, and light pole foundations. That work is in the overnight hours, Sunday night through Friday morning. There are lane restrictions on the St. Rose Parkway.

At St. Rose Parkway at 215, drop inlet and storm drain installation, traffic signal modifications do continue in the overnight hours. We have lane restrictions on St. Rose Parkway for that work.

Green Valley Parkway between 215 and Village Walk Drive. We will have potholing for a couple nights. That'll be mid to late September. There will be lane restrictions on Green Valley Parkway for a couple nights to get that pothole in formation.

All right, bike path and trail detours. So the 215 trail, Green Valley Parkway to Valle Verde will close tonight. It will be detoured to Paseo Verde. That's to allow for the storm drain installation.

The 215 trail Arroyo Grande to Stephanie should be closing in late September. And again, the detour will be Paseo Verde Parkway. That's in order to build the retaining walls.

The bike path is closed on St. Rose Parkway between Coronado Center and Paseo Verde. That's A long-term closure. In the picture, you can see the storm drain installation as it's progressing down the Beltway, and the backfill that goes along with that associated work.
